Kankakee Street over Jackson Creek Scope of Work

Project Description/Preliminary Scope of Services

This project consists of all design services to replace the Kankakee Street bridge over Jackson Creek (Existing SN 099-3225). The work will include the complete replacement of the structure, channel and bank stabilization and needed roadway approach reconstruction or reprofiling.

The work includes structure selection, all design and associated reports, permitting from all necessary regulatory agencies, right of way plats and legal descriptions, and construction document preparation activities necessary to construct the project. The Road District will acquire any necessary easements and right of way.

This construction of the project will be funded through the Township Bridge Program.
